## Estimated Expenses – Academic Year 2021-2022

These are the estimated MINIMUM expenses for <u>undergraduate</u> international students at the University of Denver for the 2021-2022 academic year. Estimates for the 2022-2023 academic year will be available by January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. These estimates assume a moderate lifestyle in which students share living accommodations and expenses with a roommate and do not include international travel or the purchase of a laptop computer, a requirement for most students. All University of Denver students are required to have health insurance. Students are required to participate in the University of Denver Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP), or to waive this plan by providing proof of other adequate health insurance coverage.
